

Author Biographies

Andrea Brait studied History, Political Science and German Studies in Vienna. She is a University Assistant at the Department of Contemporary History and the School of Education / University of Innsbruck. She teaches and investigates, with a particular interest in remembrance policy and musealisation, the relations of Austria with its neighbouring countries and the field of history didactics; she has provided numerous lectures and publications on these topics.

Anna Caban has been working as an archivist in the State Archive in Opole since 2003. She graduated from the Faculty of History of the University of Lublin. She is mainly involved in provision, protection of personal data and digitalisation.

Bartosz Górecki is an archivist and historian working in the State Archive in Łódź. He studied history at the University of Łódź. His research explores the economic and contemporary history of Poland. He is an active participant in the educational and popularising activities undertaken by the Polish National Archive. Among other publications, he is the author of the graphic novel *November Photographs (Listopadowe zdjęcia)* devoted to the events of 11 October 1918.

Dr **Agata G. Handley** is Assistant Professor in the Department of Philology at the University of Łódź. The main areas of her academic interests are contemporary British and Canadian Literature and British culture with a special emphasis on the English North. She is the author of the book *Constructing Identity: Continuity, Otherness and Revolt in the Poetry of Tony Harrison* (2016) and is a member of the editorial team of *Text Matters: A Journal of Literature, Theory and Culture*.

Prof. Dr **Hassan A. Jamsheer**, lecturer at the Chair of International Relations of the Warsaw Management Academy. Until 2012, head at the Chair of Middle Eastern Studies, Institute of History, Department of Philosophy and History, University of Łódź. As a historian and specialist in international affairs, he is interested mainly in the Arab and Islamic world. A Member of the Oriental Sciences Committee of the Polish Academy of Sciences as well as many other international and Polish expert societies.

Dr **Sławomir Jan Maksymowicz** graduated from the Institute of History at the Pedagogical University (WSP) in Olsztyn in 1995. Since 1995 he has been work-

ing as an archivist in the Department of Processing Former German Files in the State Archive in Olsztyn (Oddział Opracowania akt poniemieckich Archiwum Państwowego w Olsztynie). In February 2014 he obtained his PhD degree in History at the University of Warmia and Mazury in Olsztyn. His scientific interests are concentrated on the history of Warmia and Mazury in 1914–1945.

Dr **Tomasz Matuszak**, a historian – archivist. A Director of the State Archive in Piotrków Trybunalski. An author, co-author and editor of seven book publications. He specialises in methodology of working with archives, in archive studies and in education in archive studies as well as in military history in particular in the history of the Polish air force in 1918–1939.

Dr **Kamila Pawełczyk-Dura**, she is working in the State Archive in Łódź. Her scientific interests are focused on the history of the Russian orthodox religion, mainly during the Soviet period, on the operation of various churches in realities of totalitarian countries as well as on Russian philosophical, theological and social-political ideas.

In addition to his research on World War I and cultural, regional and urban history, his interests primarily focus on the phenomena of multiculturalism, religion and memory in Central and Eastern Europe, as well as on the relationship between history, literature and media, especially photography and film.

Dr **Marcos Silber**, a senior lecturer at the Department of Jewish History and chair of the Department of Multidisciplinary Studies at the University of Haifa in Israel. He has published numerous works on the Jewish experience during WWI in the Polish lands as well as on Jewish autonomism, Yiddish cinema and popular culture and Polish-Israeli relations.
